Recently, Bremen Township has launched its new Youth & Family Program, which includes youth counseling along with additional programs as well to fit all ages. These services are free to any and all township residents between the ages of 5-18 years of age at our Wellness Center at our Oak Forest facility.

Newly drawn county and congressional maps have given us new County Commissioner Monica Gordon and Congressman Sean Casten for portions of Bremen Township and we welcome them and look forward to working closely with them on Township issues. We are very excited and proud that our new Congressman has chosen to re-locate a satellite office within Bremen Township and be the townships new neighbor at our Oak Forest Complex on Oak Park Ave. The close proximity and availability of sharing their questions and concerns with their very own Congressman is a plus for our residents.



**John D. Lord** – TOWNSHIP CLERK

As I have expressed in the past, the Clerk's Office plays a vital role in the electoral process from voter registration to the presentation of certified results. One area that stands out is the difference between registered voters and ballots cast in local elections. Reports from the Cook County Clerk's Office indicate that participation in local contests such as for our Mayors, Alderpersons, Trustees, along with School Board members is generally about 14%. These are the contests that have more of an impact on our communities, schools and leaders in our respective towns, villages or cities Putting this into perspective means that out of 1,000 eligible voters, less than 80 participants determine what direction, taxes we pay, and who we chose as community leaders. We need to remember that the only avenue we have to

determine the quality of our elected officials and direction of our home towns is to cast our vote is to cast our vote. Each and every vote matters and has the ability to be the deciding factor for the future of your community. I urge all residents to be engaged and exercise your right to vote.

The Cook County Assessor's Office has begun mailing out exemption renewal applications for Senior and Disabled persons only, with a deadline of return on May 10th. Applications for Disabled Veterans and long time occupants are scheduled to be mailed on May 12th, with a return deadline of June 14th. Once you have received your renewal application please call our office for any questions or assistance in submitting them. Please remember, the county will now only renew regular Homeowner and Senior Homeowner exemptions. Seniors receiving the Senior Freeze exemption must re-apply. Missed exemptions for previous years as far back as 2018 can still be applied for.

It appears the snow gods were watching over us this past winter, with one of the most snow free day seasons in recent memory which gave us more time to prepare for the upcoming construction season.

Bid requests were presented and received for resurfacing projects in many areas throughout the township that will be completed this summer and early fall.

Just a reminder, with the spring rains coming, it is important that we keep our culvert and drainage ditches free of leaves and debris to maintain proper storm water flow and avoid any potential flooding.

## Upgrades & Improvements

We recently completed upgrading our computer and phone systems at both facilities to keep pace with the rapid improvements in technology. These upgrades were long overdue, and will in the long run, prove to be more cost effective by eliminating repair and service call expenses. We are also in the process of revamping our web site in order to make it more user friendly and provide more capabilities for residents to obtain updated reports and access information. The township has also upgraded the fire protection and alarm system in the newly renovated Wellness Center which will continue to provide Youth counseling and other activities.

At this time, a comprehensive five year plan is being developed to make physical improvements to both facilities beginning this year. Slated for this season is a facelift on our Markham facility which will include new landscaping, lighting and signage. The Oak Forest facility will consist of new plantings along our walking path and the construction of exterior comfort stations in addition to a new four season room.

The Board of Trustees takes pride in the fact that the cost of these improvements will come from savings the township has made in previous years and will not require any borrowing and will not increase taxes for our residents.

## N.A.M.I. Partnership

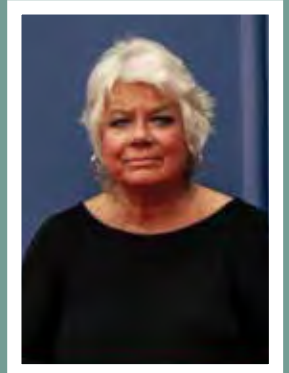

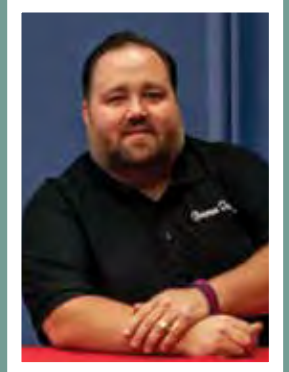

### Saying Goodbye to an Institution

The Cook County Bureau of Asset Management will begin demolition of buildings on the Oak Forest campus in July of 2023. These buildings are outdated, have been vacant for years, and are extremely costly to maintain. As demolition is completed, the county will engage with the community about future plans for the property.

**Public Information Plan:** The county will keep residents and businesses informed via community meetings, briefings with local officials, mailed bulletins and electronic newsletters. The public can also communicate questions and concerns directly to the Bureau of Asset Management at Audrey.Jonas@cookcountyil.gov. **Time Table:** This project will begin this spring and projected to be completed in January of 2026 while having minimum impact upon traffic. All precautions will be taken to ensure air quality is maintained.

### Social Security and Medicare

My office can also assist with Social Security and Medicare issues, like helping release owed Social Security Disability back pay, reinstating Medicare after it is wrongfully canceled, clarifying miscommunications or mistakes between the agency and you, and receiving updates regarding pending applications.

**On Saturday, April 22nd**, E-Waste will be collected at our Oak Forest location – 15350 Oak Park Ave. Computers, printers, cables of all sorts, holiday lights, small electronic appliances, and batteries will be accepted. Because of limited space, only one TV per family will be allowed.

**On Saturday, April 29th** these same services will be provided at our Markham facility – 16361 Kedzie Ave.

In addition to electronic devices, residents will be able to dispose of unwanted prescription drugs anonymously in prescription bottles which will be shredded to destroy identity or in unmarked plastic bags.

**Both these events will begin at 9:00 A.M. and end when the truck is filled.**

## WELCOME FRIENDS OF INDIAN BOUNDARY PRAIRIES

This is a volunteer organization that helps promote public awareness, understanding, education and appreciation of our remnant natural areas. Within our boundaries we still have a cluster of five protected high quality native grasslands one of which has been named a National Natural Landmark by the U.S. Department of the Interior because of its importance as a natural asset which includes some of the finest tall grass prairie preserves in the Midwest.

We welcome this organization with open arms as they regroup after the toll the pandemic has affected them, and wish them all the best in continuing with their important mission. Working and collaborating together will be beneficial to both the Friends and the residents as they will be presenting programs and educating our residents about the natural areas within the township. This Spring new native grasses and seedlings will be planted throughout our walking path to restore areas that attract endangered wildlife such as the Monarch butterfly.

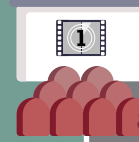
